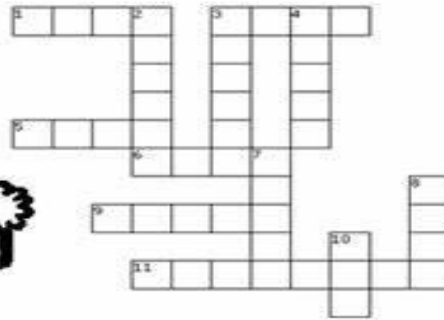
A HUGE THANK YOU TO COSTAIN VOLUNTEERS
